

IRIC Team Formation Guidelines

1. Registration Process:

1.1 Registration Submission: Participants are required to register for the IRIC competition by completing the registration form available on the official website.

1.2 Confirmation Email: Upon successful registration, participants will receive an email from the IRIC committee by March 15, 2024. It is imperative to carefully read the email as it will contain information regarding acceptance or rejection.

1.3 Acceptance Notification: If accepted, participants are requested to add or scan the provided group chat link or QR code found at the bottom of the acceptance email.

2. Group Chat and Team Formation:

2.1 Joining the Participant Group: Upon successfully adding the provided link or scanning the QR code, participants will be integrated into the IRIC group chat (WeChat or Discord).

2.2 Civilized Communication: Participants are expected to engage in civilized and respectful communication within the group chat. No advertisements and outside commercials are allowed to be sent in the group chat. If the participants violated the requirements above, the IRIC committee has the right to remove the participants from the group chat.

2.3 Team Formation: Within the group chat, participants are encouraged to form teams consisting of 2-6 members with individuals who share similar interests.

3. Team Registration:

3.1 Submission Requirement: Each formed team must complete a team registration form. The form should include a clear description of the team captain, members, and the chosen academic field of interest.

4. Overview of IRIC Schedule:

4.1 Schedule Review: Once teams are successfully formed, participants are strongly advised to review the IRIC schedule, regulations, and guidelines that are provided. Understanding the overall timeline and requirements of IRIC will help teams plan and execute their research effectively.
